RES is commencing statutory consultation on proposals for Steeple Renewables Project, a new solar farm project with battery storage and ecological mitigation and enhancement areas, located at Sturton-le-Steeple, Nottinghamshire. Set across approximately 1700 acres near the site of the former West Burton Power Station, RES has a grid connection agreement up to 600MW for combined solar and battery energy storage.

In late 2023, we undertook early informal consultation on our initial proposals with the local community. We appreciate the valuable feedback we received from residents and stakeholders, which has informed our emerging proposals.

We are now seeking your views as part of our statutory consultation, where we are presenting more detailed proposals for the Steeple Renewables Project. This feedback form sits alongside our wider suite of consultation materials, including a consultation brochure and Preliminary Environmental Information Report (PEIR) and the PEIR Non-Technical Summary. ## **Community benefits and LEDS**

RES believes that our renewable energy schemes should provide meaningful benefits locally and we continue to invite input on priority aims and projects for the area which Steeple Renewables Project may be able to support, if consented. Please refer to page 28 of the consultation brochure where we have provided more information on RES' Local Electricity Discount Scheme (LEDS) which could potentially provide homes and businesses within 1km of the built project with a minimum annual discount of £350\* on their electricity bills for the lifetime of the project.

Please note: The provision of community benefits as part of Steeple Renewables Project is not treated as a material consideration in the DCO application. As such, it will not influence the recommendation of the Planning Inspectorate or the decision of the Secretary of State regarding consent for the project. Further, any support expressed for community benefit will be considered separately to your views on the planning application.

\*Final discount level and extent of eligible area will be determined following consultation with the local community and will depend on the installed capacity of the final constructed project.
